What School Supplies do I need for Middle School???

The key to being successful in Middle School is being **ORGANIZED**. We recommend a folder and notebook for each class. Below is a list of supplies that the teachers recommend for next year.

<u>Sports:</u> Football, Cross Country, Swimming, Volleyball, Basketball, Wrestling, Track and Field, Baseball, Softball, Cheerleading

<u>Clubs and other Activities:</u> Tech Club, Robotics, School Store, Peer Mediators, National Junior Honor Society (NJHS), and other clubs dependent on student interest (For example, past clubs include Bible Club, Pokemon Club, Anime Club, Book Club)

LOCKERS:

You will be assigned a locker the first week of school. The combination lock is attached to the locker so you do not need to bring a lock. Your locker is your own, so you do not share lockers. The lockers are fairly new and easy to open as long as you know how to use a combination lock. Your teachers will allow for time to practice opening your locker, but it is highly recommended that you learn how to use a combination lock over the summer.

BULLYING:

We have a Zero Tolerance policy for bullying. We have numerous ways to report bullying such as our bully box, our bullying email address, and signing up to see a counselor. We have bullying awareness activities, such as Pink Shirt days and do lessons on anti-bullying in the classroom.

LOCATING CLASSES:

O.W. Best is pretty easy to navigate. There are signs in the hallway to tell you which direction to go to find the Cafeteria, Gym, and other rooms. The classes are all pretty close together so the 5 minutes in-between classes is plenty of time to class and to go to your locker/use the restroom. Your teachers too will give you more time during the first couple of weeks of school as they know you are still figuring things out.

TEACHERS:

0.W. Best teachers are just like your elementary school teachers—helpful, caring, and kind! Our teachers can't wait to meet you and build great relationships with you next year! The teachers make their rules and classroom expectations very clear and are willing to go above and beyond to help you be successful in their class.

HOMEWORK:

Teachers typically give class time to start working on assignments. Math is the only class that you can expect to have 10-15 minutes of HW every night. In Language Arts and Social Studies, you may have HW 1-2 times a week for 20 minutes or less. In Science and your Elective classes, assignments are done in class and you rarely have HW. So as long as your use your time wisely, you shouldn't have too much work every night. When there are tests you would have to spend time studying and occasionally there may be a project which too would take more time but teachers give you plenty of notice for tests and projects.
